Dan O'Malley and FGM Architects addressed the Committee and presented proposed exterior elevations, floor plans and site plan for the new Fire Station 22. The station is on 2.8 acres and consists of 23 square feet for 14 staff.

The Committee had several questions including the infiltration basin near the property, regrading and lighting. Trustee Mills requested that staff meet with surrounding homeowners to present the proposal. The Committee inquired whether the proposed elevation was the only proposal received and asked that they see all the renderings. A special PH&S meeting will be scheduled on January 5, 2026 to review the plans. Mr. O'Malley will send what they have to the Committee this week.

The Special Public Health & Safety Committee meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

3. OLD BUSINESS

**A. Authorization of the Design, Floor Plans and Site Plan for the construction of new
Fire Station #22.**

An item summary sheet Fire Chief Wax and Dan O'Malley was presented to Committee.

Mr. O'Malley, Chief Wax, and architect Jake McLoughlin, presented updated designs and site layouts.

Several board members inquired as to why the design wasn't replicated like Station #21 as they all liked it. Mr. McLoughlin stated several factors that went into the decision in its size and orientation. The original size was reduced after evaluating space needs and storage requirements,

referencing efficiencies learned from Fire Station 21. Station 22 will be approximately 23,000 square feet, larger than Station 21 and Station 24, housing 8–14 personnel. A mezzanine provides the storage space needed and helps reduce total building size.

Trustee Mills asked why it wasn't designed so more of it shows on Higgins Road. Mr. McLaughlin indicated multiple massing and layout options had been studied, considering access, stormwater management, topography, and cost factors. Due to shared access easements with an adjacent bank and stormwater flow requirements hinders moving the building closer to Higgins Road. Its current orientation provides the most efficient use of the site.

Trustee Arnet and other board members asked about the lighting and choice of colors. Mr. Palm noted that if the board is okay with the general shape, discussions on the coloring and other details can be sorted out later.

Trustee Pilafas inquired about the price difference between the six options. Mr. O'Malley explained the massing options came in before the estimates.

Trustee Mills asked about the smaller bay tacked on at the end of the building. Mr. McLaughlin cited a few reasons for the design, one being next to residential property and not make it seem like one giant mass. The other consideration was access easement to the west. They didn't want a tall building so close to the driveway and bank.

Mayor McLeod noted that he liked the idea of having different looks for the fire stations especially as it shows sensitivity to the residents around the individual facilities.

Motion by Trustee Pilafas, seconded by Mayor McLeod to authorize Design, Floor Plans and Site Plan for the construction of new Fire Station #22. Voice vote taken. All ayes. Motion carried.

REQUEST SUMMARY

Service and products are offered through the State of Illinois Joint Purchasing Program or Suburban Purchasing Cooperative in providing the purchasing government agency with the lowest costs based on volume discounting by vendors providing such services or product.

Both the State of Illinois Joint Purchasing and Suburban Purchasing Cooperative currently offer a 2026 Ford F150 Responder vehicle. The State's purchasing contract offers a 2026 Ford F150 Responder through Sutton Ford of Matteson, IL, at \$54,704.00 as optioned. Suburban Purchasing Cooperative offers a 2026 Ford F150 Responder through Currie Motors of Frankfort, IL, priced at \$50,257.00 as optioned. An additional quote was received from Friendly Ford of Roselle, IL, at \$50,250.63 as optioned.

Our request includes the cost of the vehicles and any factory, or dealer related costs only. The lowest priced vehicle is offered from Friendly Ford of Roselle, IL, which the Village has purchased vehicles from previously. The two (2) vehicles we are requesting will consist of one (1) Community Service Vehicle, and one (1) Administrative Service Vehicle.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is sufficient funding in the FY2026 budget to fund these two (2) vehicles.

RECOMMENDATION

Request authorization to purchase two (2) 2026 Ford F-150 Responder vehicles as optioned, from Friendly Ford of Roselle, IL, in the amount of \$100,501.26.

PATROL DIVISION ACTIVITY REPORT

During the month of December the Patrol Division responded to 3393 calls for service. The following is a brief summary of some of the activities:

On December 2nd, Officer D. Miraglia was dispatched to a motorist assist in the area of Golf Road and Stonehedge Drive. Upon arrival, he observed a vehicle that had become immobilized on the center median of the roadway. While speaking with the driver, Officer Miraglia noted that the individual appeared disoriented and detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the driver's breath. Based on these observations, the driver was asked to perform standardized field sobriety tests, which indicated signs of impairment. The driver was subsequently taken into custody for suspicion of Driving Under the Influence. During a search incident to arrest, Officer Miraglia located three hand-rolled cigarettes containing a green leafy substance, suspected to be cannabis. The driver was transported to the police station and submitted to chemical testing, which resulted in Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) of 0.132. The subject was cited and released for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, DUI Over .08, Unlawful Possession of Cannabis, Illegal Transportation of Alcohol/Driver, Improper Lane Usage and Uninsured Motor Vehicle.



On December 2nd, Hoffman Estates Police Officers responded to a report of a physical domestic incident in the 1300 block of Rosedale Lane. The 911 caller stated her son had physically assaulted his pregnant girlfriend and fled the scene on foot, last seen in the vicinity of the Hoffman Estates Public Library. Officers F. Ortiz and Ochoa located the suspect nearby and initiated a foot pursuit. During the pursuit, Officer Corneil deployed the department's drone, which successfully tracked the suspect's movements. The suspect eventually entered a marsh area on the Hilldale Golf Course property, where Officers Ortiz and Ochoa were able to apprehend him. During the apprehension, both officers fell through thin ice in the marsh and became temporarily stuck in thick mud. The Hoffman Estates Fire Department responded to the scene to assess the condition of the officers and the suspect. No injuries were reported. The suspect was charged with Felony Aggravated Domestic Battery, Felony Aggravated Battery of a Person who is Pregnant, Felony Domestic Battery with a Prior Conviction and a Misdemeanor Resisting Arrest.

On December 6, Officers Woodbury and Raffaelli were dispatched to the 900 block of Grand Canyon Parkway in response to a reported domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the 911 caller and his spouse. The investigation determined that the parties had been involved in a verbal argument. During a safety pat-down of the male subject, officers located a small bag containing a white powdery substance in the subject's front pants pocket. The substance was later field-tested and confirmed to be cocaine. The subject was taken into custody by Officer Woodbury and transported to the police station for processing. He was subsequently charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance.

On December 6, Officers Bachmann, Perez, and Raffaelli responded to a single-vehicle crash at the intersection of Barrington and Golf Roads. Upon arrival, it was determined that the vehicle involved had been traveling eastbound in the westbound lanes of Golf Road. The vehicle subsequently struck a traffic light support pole located at the northwest corner of the intersection. During the course of the investigation, Officer

Bachmann detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the driver's breath, along with other observable indicators of impairment. The driver admitted to consuming multiple alcoholic drinks. Following a DUI investigation, the driver was placed under arrest. At the police station, the driver submitted to chemical testing, which disclosed a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.209. The subject was cited with Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, BAC Over .08 and Improper Lane Usage.

On December 10, Officers Kowal, F. Ortiz, and Herran were dispatched to a report of a retail theft in progress at a retail store located on Sutton Road. Prior to officers' arrival, the offender was reported to have fled the scene. Responding officers conducted a search of the immediate and surrounding area; however, the suspect vehicle was not located. Officer Kowal obtained video surveillance footage and compared it with information associated with the registered owner of the suspect vehicle. The comparison confirmed that the offender matched the description of the vehicle's owner, who was identified as residing in Vernon Hills. Officer Kowal notified the Vernon Hills Police Department of the incident and advised them of probable cause to detain the offender if located. Vernon Hills officers subsequently located the offender at their residence and placed them into custody. Officer Kowal responded to the Vernon Hills Police Department, where he took custody of the offender and recovered the stolen merchandise. The subject was cited for Retail Theft and released.

On 11 December, Officers Baker and D. Miraglia responded to a personal injury crash in the area of Shoe Factory and Bartlett Roads. Upon arrival, Officer Baker observed that one of the individuals involved had sustained a traumatic leg injury and was experiencing significant bleeding. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, Officer Baker immediately provided first aid and applied a tourniquet to the injured leg, successfully controlling the bleeding prior to the arrival of paramedics. The individual was subsequently stabilized and transported to Lutheran General Hospital for further treatment.

On 29 December 2025, Officer Grady conducted a follow-up investigation in the 100 block of Peasant Street regarding a case originally reported in August of 2025 in which the victim reported losing her debit card and later discovered multiple fraudulent charges. As part of the investigation, Officer Grady obtained a subpoena for DraftKings records related to two unauthorized transactions. She also requested surveillance footage from a local business where an additional fraudulent charge had occurred. Upon reviewing the footage, Officer Grady observed the suspect using a debit card consistent with the victim's reported lost card to complete a purchase. On 12/02/25, DraftKings provided account information that enabled Officer Grady to identify the offender. Through open-source research, she located the suspect's residential address and made contact with him at his home. Officer Grady confirmed that the individual matched the suspect seen in the surveillance footage using the victim's debit card. The suspect was transported to the police station, where he provided a full confession to the offense and was charged with Unlawful Use of Credit/Debit Card.

PROMOTIONS

On December 1, the police department celebrated the promotions of **Commander Mark Wondolkowski**, and **Sergeant Luis Zavala** who were sworn-in by Mayor McLeod at the Village Board meeting.

Commander Wondolkowski is a veteran officer with 27 years of experience while **Sergeant Zavala** brings 7 years in Patrol. Together they will apply their knowledge and experience to lead the Patrol Night Shift.

INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION REPORT

During the month of December, Detective Garcia continued to assist on several Unauthorized Recording investigations stemming from a search warrant for a child pornography investigation. Detective Garcia meticulously reviewed data extractions to identify files and locate embedded metadata to help secure approval for nine counts of Felony Unauthorized Recording.

On 05 December, Detective Shaw was assigned a Harassment by Telephone investigation in which a 35-year-old female victim from Streamwood reported a former friend of hers had been texting a third-party subject unsettling media and messages as well as responding to her current places of employment in Hoffman Estates. The victim provided media and messages to support these allegations and the offender, a 43-year-old male resident of Aurora, was charged with Harassment by Telephone. This investigation is Cleared by Arrest.

On 09 December, Detectives Shaw, Ramos, Garcia, Parks, and O'Shea assisted with a residential search warrant in Chicago reference a shooting that occurred at a local bar. All detectives assisted with conducting a thorough search of the residence for items within the scope of the search warrant.

On 09 December, Detective Parks continued his investigation into a shooting that occurred on the 27th of November at a local bar in which a security guard, a 46-year-old Chicago resident, fired shots at a 38-year-old Hoffman Estates resident after he broke a window of the door to the bar with a metal pole. One of the shots stuck the victim in the chest, and he was transported to a local hospital for treatment. Detective Parks spoke with the victim at the hospital, and a photo lineup was administered to the victim, who positively identified the offender. The offender was ultimately contacted, and a date was set to meet at the Hoffman Estates Police Department. The offender rescheduled the date twice, and as a result a search warrant was obtained for his residence. On December 9th, the search warrant was executed and the gun used in the shooting and the offender's cell phone were collected. The offender was taken into custody and transported to the Hoffman Estates Police Department for further investigation. During questioning, the offender stated he was acting in self-defense. Detective Parks along with the Cook County State's Attorney contacted felony review for possible charges. Detective Parks was informed that no felony charges would be approved due to the facts of the case and the claim of

self-defense. After further review, no other applicable misdemeanor charges existed. This investigation is Cleared by Arrest without Charges.

On 09 December, Detective Garcia was assigned a Burglary investigation in which a subject had made entry into a restricted area of a local hospital and stole four laptop computers. Detective Garcia worked with Officer Adlon and a positive identification was made on the 48-year-old male Indiana resident by way of hospital security officers who had prior contact with the offender as an unwanted subject a few days prior. Officer Adlon contacted Felony Review for an arrest warrant and, after obtaining additional identifications of the offender from other law enforcement sources as well as video surveillance footage from the hospital, an arrest warrant was approved and issued on 12/26/25. The offender in this investigation was found to be the suspect in an arson in Schaumburg, as well as an offender in a burglary in Naperville where he was apprehended at the scene and was in possession of a gas can as well as four firearms and numerous rounds of ammunition. An informational bulletin was disseminated to local law enforcement agencies. This investigation is Cleared by Felony Arrest pending warrant service.



On 17 December, Detective Shaw continued his investigation into a Battery that occurred at a local bar. Detective Shaw arranged to have the suspect, a 71-year-old male resident of Wayne, IL, turn himself in for making unwanted contact with a waitress that was captured on surveillance video. The suspect arrived at the Hoffman Estates Police Department and was charged and processed accordingly.

On 17 December, Detective Shaw continued his investigation into a Theft that occurred when a juvenile offender stole a sweatshirt from another juvenile. Detective Shaw facilitated a restitution arrangement and collected the restitution funds and turn them over to the victim's mother.

On 21 December, Detective Garcia continued his investigation of a Theft from May 2024 in which a package was stolen from an apartment building. Detective Garcia was able to identify the suspect, a 61-year-old male resident of Hoffman Estates. Being unable to locate the suspect, an arrest warrant was issued and Detective Garcia later obtained admissions from the suspect who was charged with Theft and processed accordingly.

JUVENILE INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION REPORT

Detective Ramos continues to evaluate and assign juvenile dispositions for various juvenile offenders in various cases. Detective Ramos is also working with her supervisors and the department Social Workers to create a more updated and streamlined juvenile disposition system for use within the department.

On 03 December, School Resource Officers Teipel and Patel, Traffic Officer Witt, and Firefighter/Paramedic Behnke presented to three special education classes at the Higgins Education Center. The students were put in a scenario and answered questions to simulate a real-life incident. The students and staff also asked questions and were able to try on both police and fire equipment. This was the fourth presentation put on for the special education department between the District 211 schools.

From 05 December through 09 December, School Resource Officer Patel addressed traffic complaints and enforced traffic laws around Frank C. Whiteley Elementary School issuing several verbal warnings in an attempt to educate motorists and parents. Officer Patel took the initiative to create and distribute educational flyers to parents via email and in person at the parent pick-up line.

On 12 December, School Resource Officer Teipel and Conant High School administration worked the Conant High School basketball and caught three students in the bathroom using an electronic vaping device. The vaping device was recovered along with a plastic bottle containing alcohol. Parents were called to pick up their students and disciplinary consequences were handed down by school administration.

On 14 December, School Resource Officer Gessert was contacted by Hoffman Estates High School administration reference an email that was received referencing the possibility of gun violence on 12/15 with a potential suspect identified as a current student. SRO Gessert contacted the on-duty patrol supervisor and coordinated a response which resulted in contact being made with the student and a threat assessment along with a search being conducted. The student denied sending the email stating that he believes his ex-girlfriend may have sent the email as he has had other incidents of fake texts and emails being sent using his information. A search of the student's room yielded negative results for weapons. A trace of the email address returned to an IP address outside of Illinois.

On 14 December, Eisenhower Junior High School Resource Officer Lowden conducted a lock down drill at Beth Tikvah Synagogue with Officers Bong and Sterkowicz. The drill took place on a Sunday when the building is occupied with students and members. Ideas and other areas of safety were communicated to synagogue administrators.

On 15 December, Eisenhower Junior High School Resource Officer Lowden continued her investigation into a Battery that had occurred in November at Fairview Elementary School. SRO Lowden met with the offender and his guardian at the Hoffman Estates Police Department to discuss the implications of the actions that were taken against the victim. This meeting constituted an Informal Station Adjustment in lieu of a formal arrest. This case is Exceptionally Cleared.

On 19 December, School Resource Officer Patel was present in the cafeteria for 7th grade lunch at Thomas Jefferson Middle School when she observed a fight break out in the middle of the cafeteria. SRO Patel intervened and separated both the students involved. After an investigation, the parents were notified of the incident, and a disciplinary consequence was handed down by the school. Parents agreed to the consequence and declined further police action.

On 26 December, School Resource Officer Patel continued her investigation from March in which a student's mother reported that her son had been communicating with an adult subject from the United Kingdom who was posing as a child and was repeatedly making unwanted contact with the student and the family via DCFS (Department of Children and Family Services) reports, mailings, and electronic means. SRO Patel conducted a thorough investigation and learned that the suspect's IP addresses were located around London, United Kingdom. An investigator from Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) contacted SRO Patel regarding this investigation and informed Patel that the suspect was arrested by Nottinghamshire Police in the United Kingdom. This investigation has been Exceptionally Cleared

TACTICAL UNIT REPORT

On 01 December, Sergeant Giacone and Detectives Kubat and Meyer developed a training course to meet state mandates for High-Risk Vehicle Stops. Using state-provided guidelines; including instructional materials designed to enhance officer learning and decision-making. The training incorporated K9 and drone operations, simunitions, and stress-based problem-solving exercises informed by relevant case law.

On 02 and 09 December, the TACT Unit conducted In-Service Training to the police department.

On 03 December, Sergeant Giacone conducted Community Response Officer (CRO) training based on the increasing number of calls for service nationwide requiring some form of Hostage Rescue (HR). The prevalence of HR incidents has grown alongside rising mental health concerns.

On 04-06 December, the TACT Unit conducted surveillance on a residence in Chicago for a subject wanted in connection to a shooting that occurred in November.

On 09 December, Sergeant Giacone assisted with the execution of a warrant at the residence of the known shooter from last month's incident. Northern Illinois Police Alarm System (NIPAS) secured the residence while evidence was collected.

On 10 December, the TACT Unit assisted Streamwood Police Department with a barricaded subject stemming from an aggravated domestic battery. The subject was taken into custody without further incident.

On 13 December, Detective Meyer started verification of all violent offenders and sex offenders residing within our Village to ensure compliance.

On 15 and 22 December, the TACT Unit conducted a garbage pull at the residence associated with the crime tip. Multiple baggies were recovered that were consistent with packaging typically used for narcotics distribution and personal use. Field tests of the recovered substances yielded positive results for cocaine and methamphetamine. Additionally, empty containers of nitrous oxide, a known inhalant narcotic, were recovered from the trash.

On 19 December, Detective Meyer completed address verification and identification of all violent offenders and sex offenders registered in Hoffman Estates.

On 22 December, Detective Bartolone recovered a revoked FOID card from a resident.

On 26 December, while conducting hotel/motel patrols, the TACT Unit observed a subject attempting to evade detection. The individual was seen crossing outside of a designated crosswalk and was subsequently identified. The subject was a documented gang member with prior cautions for violent and homicidal behavior. A warrant for his arrest was confirmed out of DuPage County, and he was transported to the originating agency.

CANINE UNIT REPORT

In December, Officer Grant Mullin and K9 Ajax conducted two vehicle sniffs for narcotics, assisted in the investigation of a residential burglary, and supported the apprehension of a violent offender. In addition to their field operations, the team completed 24 hours of K9 training.



STAFF SERVICES REPORT

December 18 - PPO Bilodeau graduated from the Cook County Sheriff's Police Academy. Chief Cawley and Sergeants Donohue and Boulahanis attended his graduation ceremony held at Proviso East High School.

The police department continues to work on redesigning the police department emblem. An advisory committee consisting of various ranked members of the department have worked with an embroidery company, with the expectation to begin wearing the new uniform patches in 2026.

December 2, December 9 – All sworn members of the police department attended Universal High-Risk Traffic Stop training which fulfills that state mandate.



NEW HIRE

On December 15, the police department welcomed new probationary police **Officer Sharmaine Harris**. PPO Harris is a lateral transfer and brings 11 years of experience and training to our department.

On 29 December- 03 January, the Department training unit ran a supplemental “mini” police academy specific to Hoffman Estates policy and procedures to the two new Probationary Police Officers

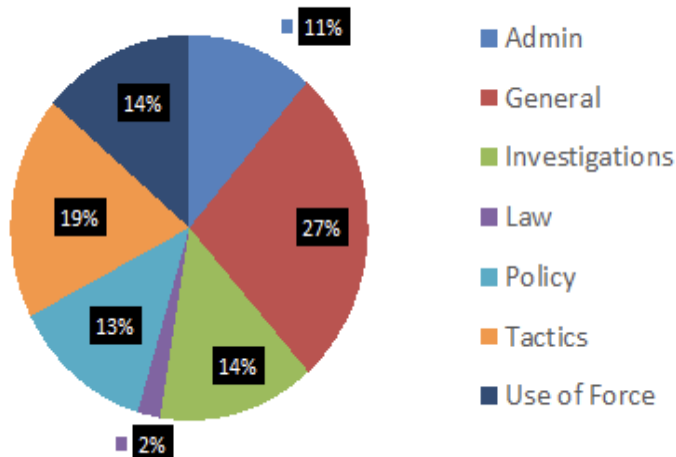

Oversized/Overweight Permit Processing

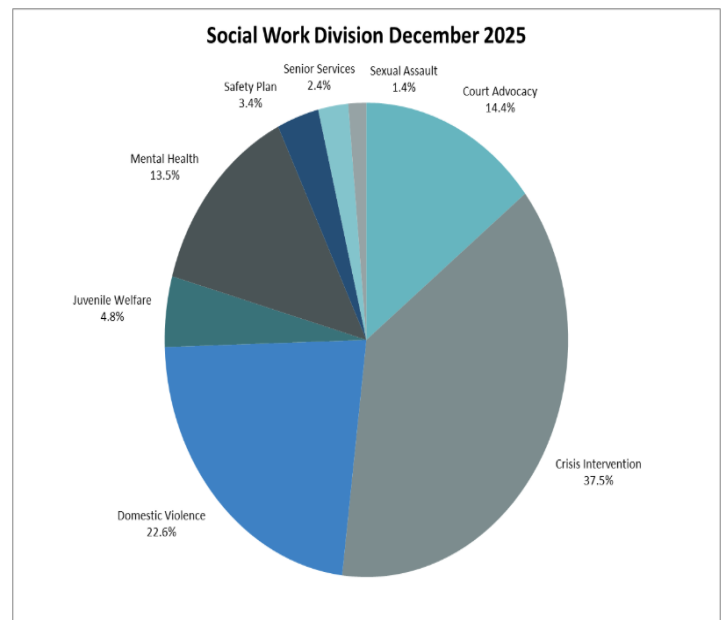
During December, Sergeant Marak processed 22 oversized/overweight vehicle permits via the Oxcart permit system, a total of 445 permits have been processed.

SHOP WITH A COP 2025

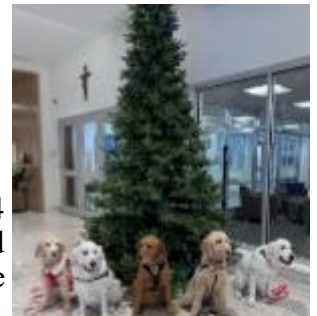

Prevention & Wellness



Health and Human Services proudly sponsored the annual Holiday Giving Tree Program for Hoffman Estates residents. The community Giving Tree program is a tradition that brings out the best in people. Sponsors who include residents, Village employees, and local businesses came together to choose tags, purchase gifts, and share in the joy of giving, turning a simple idea into a meaningful expression of care. This year, HHS was able to serve residents across the lifespan, from a newborn to an individual who is 103 years old! Through this program's efforts, we were able to provide holiday gifts to 29 seniors and 50 children, ensuring that some of the most vulnerable members of the community felt remembered and supported during the holiday season. Programs like the Giving Tree don't just deliver presents, they strengthen community connection and remind everyone that generosity can have a lasting and meaningful impact. We are grateful to all those who contributed to this program and allow us to serve the community each year.

The Dementia Friendly Community Committee hosted a community education speakers series event entitled, Alice's Journey, a Panel Discussion on December 10, 2025. Alice's Journey highlights the real-life experiences of a woman living with Dementia and provides valuable insights for caregivers, families, and community members. This panel discussion helped increase awareness and access to resources for community members with Dementia and their families. Featured Panelists included from the Village of Hoffman Estates Chief Kasia Cawley, Cathy Dagian RN, Nataly Correa, MSW, LCSW, and Firefighter/Paramedic, Pete Behnke. Community partner panelists included: Crissy Castillo from Kenneth Young, Dr. Christopher D'Agostino, DO, board-certified in Adult and Geriatric Psychiatry at Ascension Alexian Brother Behavioral Health Hospital, Gustavo Guzman from New Summit, Dawn Davis from Comfort Keepers, Lori Gibson from Home for Life Advantage, INC, Allison Green, AuD, CSA, owner of Assisted Living Locators and Eldercare Advisor. Dr. Audra Marks was the Panel Moderator for Alice's Journey.

HHS hosted a WITS Workout class for older adults at the Hoffman Estates branch library on December 16th, with ten (10) participants in attendance. Offered monthly to residents, the program promotes cognitive health through brain exercises, social interaction, and problem-solving activities that help maintain mental sharpness and independence. Nursing staff offered 2 sessions of WITS Workout for Village employees in December. Eight employees attended the event. *Memory Minders*, a new program developed by HHS nursing staff, will launch in January 2026 with a new curriculum for community members.

Treatment and Crisis Response

Health and Human Services provides quality preventative health services to the community. In December staff provided 47 infant and children's vaccinations and 6 adult vaccinations. Through these vaccinations, a total of 72 child and 10 adult antigens were administered. One hundred ten (110) preventative screenings were completed which include blood pressure (59), and pulse screenings (11), blood sugar (6), Hemoglobin (2), TB (13), Cholestech/CardioChek (3) and Tanita (4) screenings. Nursing staff provided Bone Density clinics for the community. Twelve (12) bone density screenings were completed. Nursing staff provided 40 hours of consultation during the month of December. Vision and Hearing Screenings were conducted to screen pre-school age children. These screenings assist with identifying difficulties in vision and hearing and utilize developmentally-appropriate techniques to screen children and identify any necessary referral or follow-up. During December, 148 vision and hearing screenings were completed. The Immunization Quality Improvement Program for the Vaccines For Children program will be meeting with nursing staff quarterly to discuss ways to improve our immunization updates at HHS clinics. These meetings will address topics such as vaccine hesitancy, documentation, and steps to help patients maintain appointments.

Health and Human Services provides both in-person and telehealth psychotherapy services to Village employees and the broader community, offering essential support that promotes well-being and a high quality of life. These services help individuals facing mental health challenges by guiding them through crises, building resilience, and developing effective coping strategies. By ensuring care is accessible, we work to reduce the risk of long-term negative impacts while also fostering awareness, breaking down stigma, and encouraging a culture of compassion and support around mental health. In December, psychology staff served 111 clients and delivered 259 hours of individual counseling, along with 11 hours of couples therapy, 3 hours of family therapy, 2 hours of clinical intakes, 11 hours of psychological testing including 3 full testing batteries, and 6 hours of crisis counseling. Charlie the Therapy Dog also participated in 15 sessions, providing comfort and helping to ease anxiety and distress through his calming presence and interaction with clients.

Emergency Assistance

Emergency assistance programs are crucial in providing immediate support to individuals and communities affected by unexpected crises, such as health emergencies and economic hardships. These programs help stabilize vulnerable populations by ensuring access to basic needs like food, shelter, utilities and medical care. By offering timely intervention, emergency assistance programs mitigate the long-term impact of crises, reduce hardship, and promote quicker recovery. They also play a vital role in preserving human dignity and fostering resilience, enabling individuals to rebuild their lives and communities with a sense of hope and security.

HHS continues to be a volunteer service extension site for the Salvation Army program. Through this program, HHS provides Salvation Army Emergency Assistance services to Hoffman Estates' residents in need. This fund provides limited financial support to families who show a need due to an unexpected emergency (i.e. insufficient funds for rent or past due utility bill). Staff meets with each client for approximately 30 minutes to assess the need for additional services and/or referrals. During the month of December, 1 resident was assisted through the Salvation Army program.

HHS is a designated site for individuals to apply for the Nicor Gas Sharing program. The program provides payment assistance with gas bills for those who qualify and meet income requirements. During the month of December, 1 resident was assisted.

The Health and Human Services Lending Closet loans wheelchairs, crutches, canes, walkers, and knee scooters to residents for a small fee. During the month of December, ten (10) items were loaned to residents.

Sharps Recycling Program

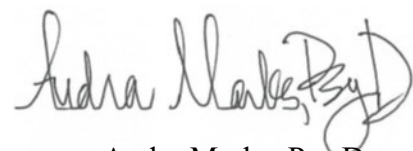
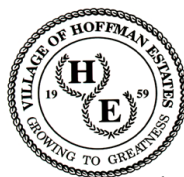
Sharps recycling programs are vital for safeguarding public health and the environment. These programs ensure the safe disposal of needles, syringes, and other medical sharps, preventing injuries and the spread of infections. The sharps recycling program promotes environmental sustainability by preventing sharps from ending up in landfills or contaminating water sources. Health and Human Services offers sharps recycling on the first Wednesday of each month. During the month of November, 40 lbs of sharps were collected and 64 lbs of sharps were collected in December.

The Village of Hoffman Estates Emergency Management status report for December 2025:

EMC:

This month was focused on closing out the year with the EMA team, last minute budget expenses and participating in two events, the Operation North Pole event and Shop with a Cop. I also hosted our annual EMA Team Volunteer Appreciation dinner which included disaster trivia.



EMA Team:

Our EMA Team participated in this year's Operation North Pole event at the Rosemont Convention Center and created a tornado Christmas tree to represent our team.

This year's EMA team participation highlights included:

- 16 special events worked with 10 High School football games
- Worked all Village Green Concerts providing traffic assistance
- Distributed public education and outreach information during the National Night Out event, Fire Station 23 Open House, Fire Station 24 Open House and Public Works Open House.
- Provided traffic assistance during the Northwest Fourth Fest fireworks, drone show and parade.
- Provided traffic assistance for the Platzkonzert.
- Completed 8 EMA Team meetings that included training on Severe Weather Spotting, Damage Assessment, Urban Search, CPR/First Aid, Reunification Site and Family Assistance Centers, and Disaster History.
- Participated in four external emergency management events that include the Hanover Township Emergency Services Conference, Schaumburg Emergency Preparedness Workshop, TIMS Traffic Training, and the Regional Urban Search Team (RUST) workshop.
- Weather monitoring for six severe weather events and two snowfall events. This included providing the National Weather Service with wind readings, monitoring radar, storm spotting and submitting snowfall totals.

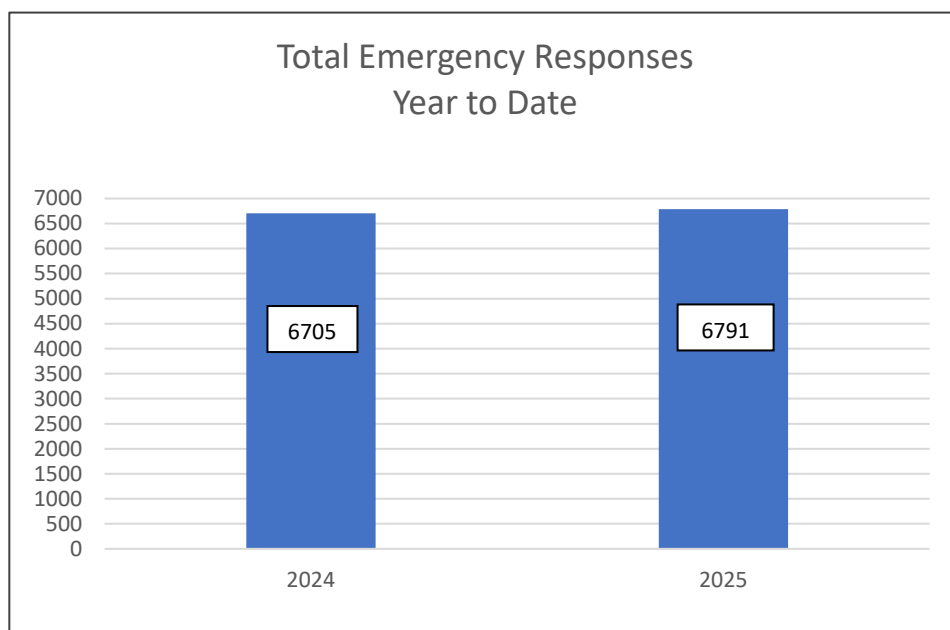

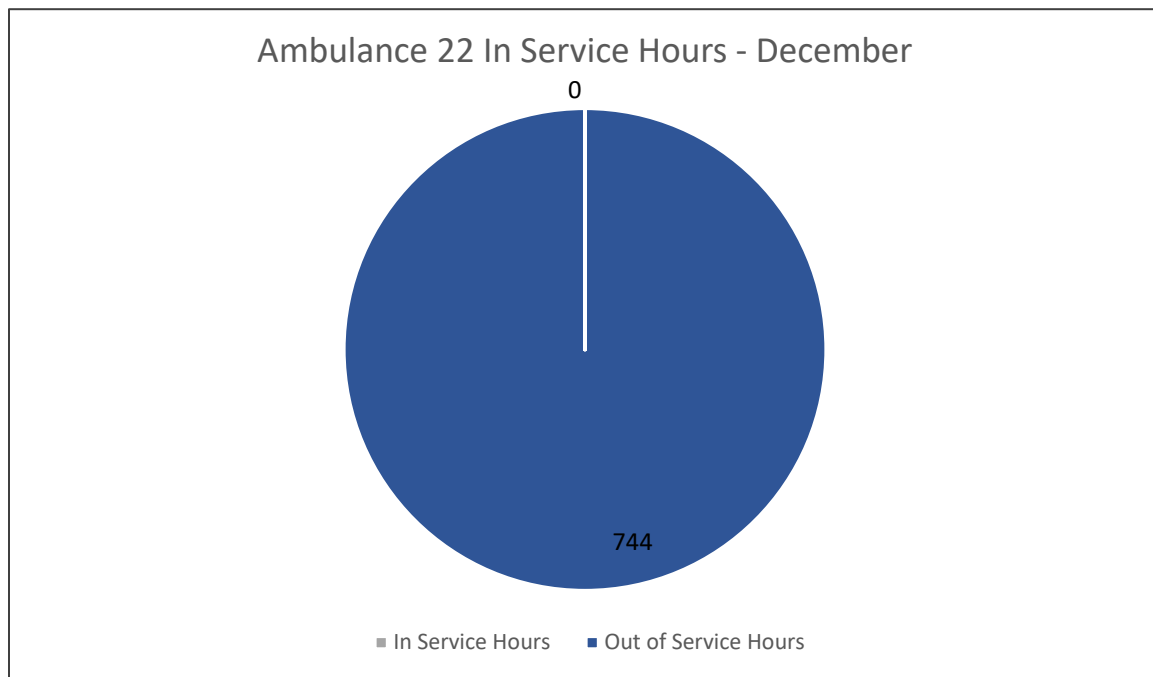

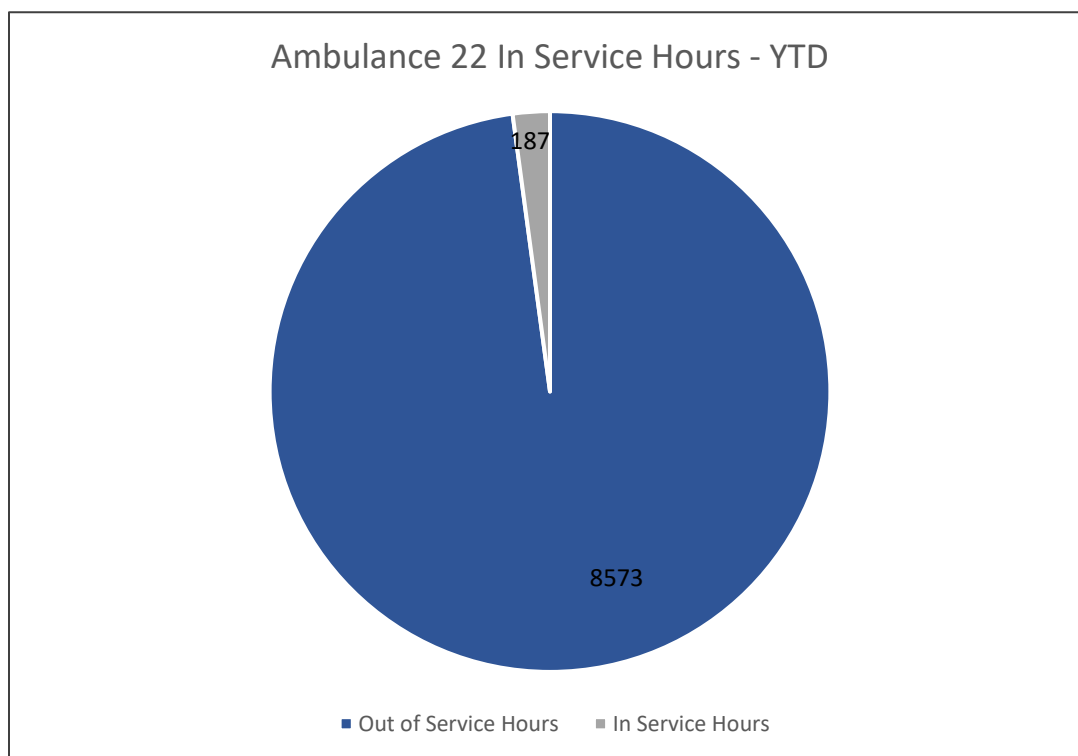
